David Fassler, M.D.

University of Vermont

David Fassler, M.D., is a child and adolescent psychiatrist practicing in Burlington, Vermont. A graduate of Yale University School of Medicine, he completed his training in adult psychiatry at the University of Vermont, and in child psychiatry at Cambridge Hospital, Harvard Medical School. He currently serves as clinical director of Otter Creek Associates, a multidisciplinary practice providing comprehensive mental health and substance abuse treatment services. Dr. Fassler is also a Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Vermont, and a member of the Board of the American Psychiatric Association.

Dr. Daniel Reisberg

Reed College

Daniel Reisberg is a Professor of Psychology at Reed College, specializing in the study of memory and perception. He is the author of more than 60 scholarly articles and chapters, and is working on his fifteenth book project. Reisberg has used his expertise to aid the criminal justice system, and has worked with defenders, prosecutors, and the police on the broad issue of how one collects and evaluates evidence from crime witnesses and victims, including child witnesses and victims. He has testified on these issues in 12 of Oregon's counties, in Federal court, and in Washington and Idaho.

Angela Rodgers

Research Associate, Portland State University

Angela Rodgers is a research associate at the Center for Improvement of Child and Family Services at Portland State University. She has been evaluating child welfare services in Oregon since 1996. Her educational background is in social and developmental psychology and systems science. Her current work includes evaluations of visitation services, subsidized guardianship and the Family Involvement Team for Recovery (Multnomah County), as well as a project funded by the Children's Justice Act to identify and reduce the trauma that children may experience during investigation, removal and placement.
